ASSAULT - Matthew Ryan, P. Kennedy, senr., P. Kennedy, junr., and John Burke, were charged with assaulting Mr Robert Underwood of the Unicorn Hotel. Mr Harris appeared for the prosecution. Mr Underwood deposed that on Thursday afternoon about five o'clock, he was upstairs in his house when he heard a noise in the bar. He came down and saw the prisoner Ryan strike a man at the bar. He then seized Ryan, when the other men rushed at him. Benjamin Gribble stated that he was struck by Ryan whilst drinking at the bar of the Unicorn Hotel, he also saw the prisoners rush at Mr Underwood. The Bench fined the prisoners 40s. each, or in default forty-eight hours' imprisonment. (*The Star - Mon 15 Feb 1858*)
