MEANINGS

Sir Dominic Daly Governor General of South Australia 1862-1863

Ringer Fastest shearer in the shed. Has become a generalized term for a station hand.

Barra Colloquial. Barramundi is a fresh & salt water fish prized for its beautiful taste and amazing strength & stamina as a sport fish. Native to the Northern Territory.

Ute Utility Vehicle. Very popular throughout rural Australia due to its versatility. In 1932 a farmer's wife wrote to Ford Australia asking why they couldn't build a car that would take them to Church on Sundays and then the pigs to market on Mondays. And so the Ute was born....

Hilux A type of Ute. The Pub Ute is a Hilux albeit slightly modified.

Chook Chicken or a colloquial term for a female.

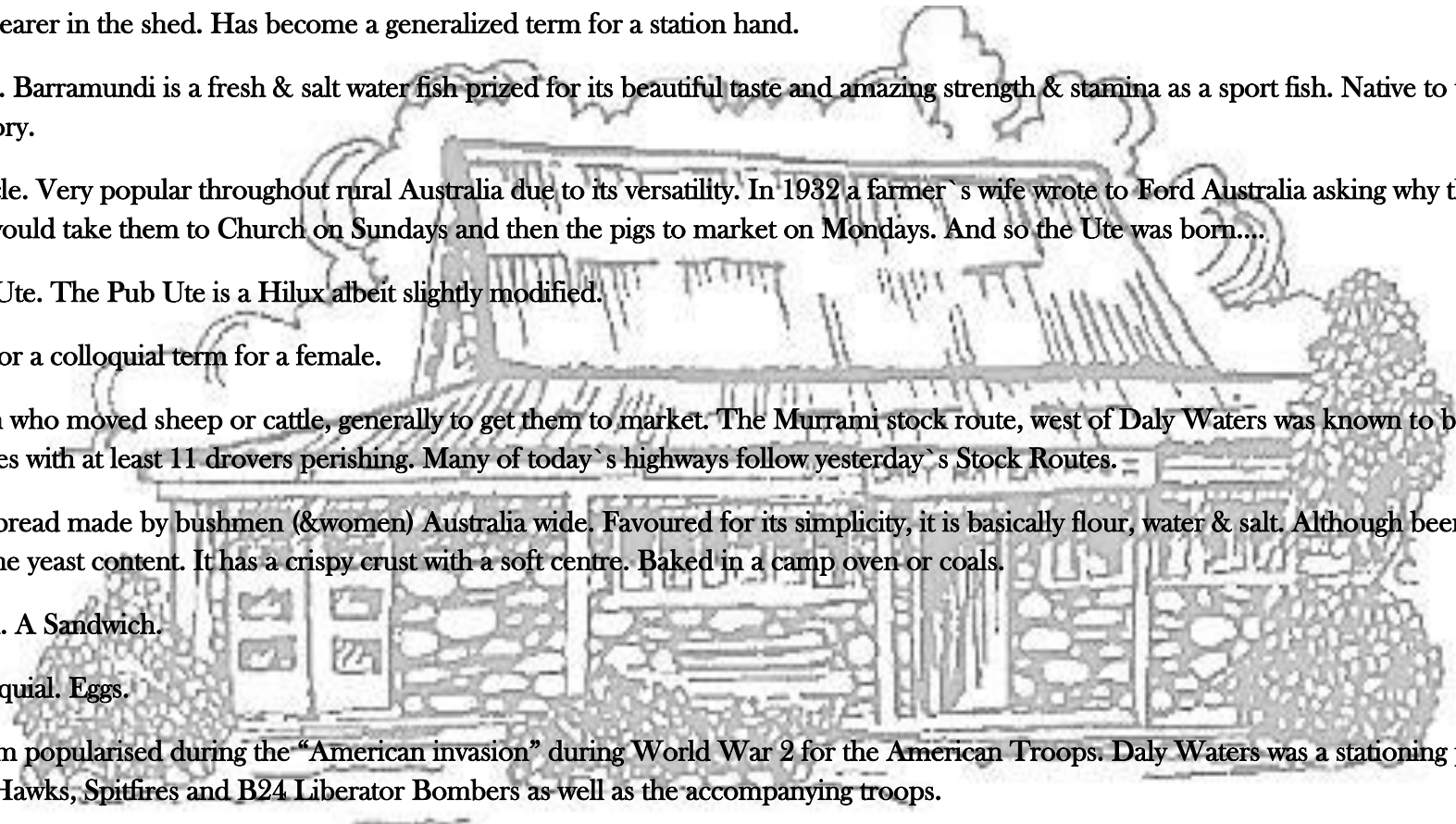
Drover A person who moved sheep or cattle, generally to get them to market. The Murrumbidgee stock route, west of Daly Waters was known to be one of the most treacherous routes with at least 11 drovers perishing. Many of today's highways follow yesterday's Stock Routes.

Damper A type bread made by bushmen (& women) Australia wide. Favoured for its simplicity, it is basically flour, water & salt. Although beer is a popular additive due to the yeast content. It has a crispy crust with a soft centre. Baked in a camp oven or coals.

Sanga Colloquial. A Sandwich.

Bum Nuts Colloquial. Eggs.

Doughboy A term popularised during the "American invasion" during World War 2 for the American Troops. Daly Waters was a stationing point for American Kitty Hawks, Spitfires and B24 Liberator Bombers as well as the accompanying troops.



A BRIEF HISTORY OF DALY WATERS

In 1862 John McDouall Stuart successfully crossed the continent from south to north. After breaking through the Lancewood scrub that thwarted his previous two attempts, Stuart discovered fresh water. This area was given the name of Daly Waters in honour of the Governor of South Australia, Sir Dominic Daly.

Fresh water was vital for droving cattle and Daly Waters was the last watering hole before the perilous Murrniji Stock Route. When the Durak Brothers drove their entire herd from Queensland to the West Australian coast, Daly Waters was a landmark stop. The cattle were rested and the men quenched their thirst, today that tradition still stands although caravans and backpackers have replaced the cattle.

The telegraph line followed Stuart`s Route north, although the untamed environment created problems and the project quickly fell behind schedule. The government would be charged a hefty fine daily until the project was complete. To avoid this, the Pony Express was introduced where a fast rider would carry messages from Daly Waters to Tennant Creek, approximately 400km.

Bi-annually “The Gulnare”, a small boat, would bring stores and ammunition up from Adelaide. The telegraph employees would ride to Leichardt`s Bar on the Roper river and collect the essential items required for the next six months.

Without the Daly Waters Telegraph Station, Sir Alexander Forrest and his party would certainly have perished. The West Australian set out to find the missing explorer Leichardt, inevitably they ran out of water approximately 200 miles west of the telegraph line. Forrest went out in search of supplies; eventually he found the telegraph line and followed it 40 miles to Daly Waters. Workers were sent out in search of the party and the dehydrated men were carried back to town and cared for until they were able to continue their search.

Despite common belief, Daly Waters was never built on the old highway. During World War 2 there were Mitchell, Hudson Bombers, Kitty Hawks and a fighter squadron based here. For defence purposes the highway has always skirted the town's perimeter.

The aerodrome played a vital role in the defence of Northern Australia, post war it became an essential refuelling base for international aircraft and the Daly Waters Pub built its reputation for second to none hospitality. Used in the London-Sydney air race and as a dispersal point for UK mail, the aerodrome once enjoyed a heavy air traffic flow. With the introduction of jet engines, domestic re-fuelling became unnecessary. These days Daly Waters Aerodrome is in a semi-retirement with private aircraft and Air-Med (remote area medical service) constituting the bulk of today's traffic.

Today Daly Waters is a ghost of its previous glory with only 9 occupants and the Daly Waters Pub being the only business in town, although it is still surrounded by cattle stations. The tourist season runs from April to September, with the Pub hosting a B&S Ball and Rodeo at Easter and a campdraft and rodeo in May.
