

Stay over in Dorrigo

With world-famous natural attractions in our backyard, when was the last time you visited Dorrigo?

Travel up the beautiful Waterfall Way, hailed as one of the world's most scenic drives, and marvel at World Heritage-listed natural wonders.

At the top of Waterfall Way is the Dorrigo Plateau, which is surrounded by nine national parks, including Gwandara Forest.

You'll see majestic views over the tree tops and down the Bellingen Valley from the Sky Walk and Griffith Lookout. Stop for a while at the Dorrigo Rain Forest Centre and learn about nature's secrets.



Choose short or longer tracks and walk through rainforest cathedrals supported by towering trees intertwined with vines and adorned with tree ferns, staghorns and bush orchids.

Keep quiet along Lyrebird Link and



spot the abundant birdlife.

Pay homage to the mighty 600-year-old Tallowood trees just a short stroll into the Norman Jolly Reserve.

Don't forget to drop by and view the construction of the World's Largest Railway Museum just a short drive out of town beside Tallowood Street.

Among this world-class rail museum are two locomotives that supplied the Western front in World War One.



When in Dorrigo surrender to its serene and friendly country charm after a round forest drive via the picturesque Platypus Flat picnic area and Cascade.

Walk the retail centre and discover arts and crafts, antiques and bric-a-brac shops.

The influx of creative artisans to call the Dorrigo Plateau home is reflected in the many shops that provide outlets for their efforts. Their energies help to excite and sustain numerous events throughout the year such as the Made In Dorrigo Day, the Dorrigo Show, Creative Art Exhibition, and the Blue Grass Festival.



For the sweet of tooth, the Dorrigo Sweet Shop is a friendly welcome to the young and old. It's a perfect opportunity to stock up on travelling lollies or small presents. For many older folk it's a window to the earlier, gentler and less complicated times of their childhood.

The old wood-fired bakery has been an institution in Dorrigo since it was built in 1948 and its ovens have been working hard ever since, serving up sweet and savoury baked treats for locals and visitors.

For those interested in history and how the years have shaped the town, the Dorrigo and Guy Fawkes Historical Museum is a fascinating journey into yesteryear with great stories and artefacts of the region. But make sure you give yourself enough time to absorb them – there's lots to see and do.

Many other attractions beckon, and for a full run-down visit the local tourist information centre not far from the Cudgery and Hickory streets intersection. While Dorrigo might be most famous for being at the hub of nine national parks, some of its most memorable attractions can be found within the town itself.
