The Watervale Hotel promotes the virtues and diversity of Clare Valley wines. Our warm days and cool nights during the growing season deliver ripe fruit character and long natural acidity – a powerful yet elegant style ideal for food accompaniment. Our diverse terroir has led to around 30 different varieties being planted. We list every variety grown and almost every producer in the region, listed by sub-region.

We particularly enjoy listing wines from small producers, side-projects, and those without Cellar Doors to give these winemakers a shop window for their craft.

We have selected an ever-changing array of wines from around the world to fill style and varietal gaps in our Clare-centric wine list. Our wines are listed by style to encourage experimentation, and all have a one-line comment to assist selection. That said, feel free to ask for advice on food matching.

All wines are available for take-away at around 20% below the restaurant list price.

We offer a Wine Masterclass at 11 am every day, which includes a tasting of six wines, to educate visitors on Clare Valley history, climate, geography, and geology. We also offer wine flights – four half-pour wines to demonstrate Clare Valley diversity.

Our Spirits list covers a world of diversity, and our cocktails have a Watervale twist that we believe enhances classics. Try a Watervale Negroni or Espresso Martini. Our cocktails and mocktails feature ingredients and garnishes from Penobscot Farm. We offer wine, cocktail or mocktail matches to our degustation dining experience!

We carry local Pikes and Clare Valley Brewing beer in cans, and local Warndu tea made from native flora. Our coffee is a fair-trade Mexican blend, roasted in the Barossa Valley.

The Clare Valley wine region – “the appellation of a thousand terroir”

Most wine appellations are demarcated by homogeneity or sameness that delivers a consistency of style associated with that region. The Clare Valley wine region is defined by its diversity.

There are three ranges that surround the Clare Valleys – each running roughly north / south. The eastern slopes feel the morning warmth, and the western the harsher afternoon sun. Northern slopes ripen more quickly, and southern slopes receive relief that extends ripening time. The Watervale bowl, as well as the plains of Stanley Flat to the north ripen fruit earlier due to longer sunshine days.

When the sun goes down each evening the hot air rises off of the plains to our north drawing air through the Clare Ranges which quickly disperses the heat leading to cool nights. The hot days ripen the fruit whilst the cool nights ensure long natural acidity and elegance.

For every 100 meters of difference in altitude, we see a difference of around 1 degree in temperature, and a week difference in hang time to achieve the same ripeness. Vineyards range in altitude from as low as 250 meters in Auburn to almost 600 meters along the range shared by Grosset, Mount Horrocks and Paulett.

Weather tends to arrive from the west dumping rain along the western ridges and Skillogalee Valley. Watervale is drier, and the Polish Hill River region drier again, with the vineyards of Mintaro experiencing the lowest rainfall.

These micro-climatic differences create vast differences in wine styles, but the real differences lie beneath the surface.

500 million years ago seismic activity created the Flinders and Clare Ranges as well as the Adelaide Hills. The Clare Ranges were formed by layers of sedimentary deposits and rocks laid down over 300 million years being bent and twisted vertically and being exposed to the atmosphere. As a result, each of the ridges and valleys that run north-south are built on completely different rocks and soils.

The oldest rocks are compacted sandstone along Spring Gully, Emu Flat (which is not flat at all), and the hills of Armagh.

The Skillogalee Valley is sedimentary dolomite, whilst a quartzite reef punctuates the next ridge that runs to the west of Watervale, through Sevenhill and north towards White Hut.

Watervale is terra rossa soil over a base of limestone that delivers distinctive lime character to its Rieslings.

Quartzite and siltstone form the high ridge that extends from White Hut along Spring Farm to Mount Horrocks.

The youngest rocks are under the Polish Hill River region, dominated by slate. These provide a mineral character to the wines.

There is no benefit derived from categorizing and ranking these different regions. Rather we are best to recognize, appreciate, and enjoy the differences. We list the sub-appellations of the Clare Valley on our list to assist with education more so than selection.

Given the multitude of micro-climates and diversity of geology, the Clare Valley region is truly the ‘appellation of a thousand terroir’. Vive la difference.

Alfred Percy Birks planted the first vines in 1892. “Wendouree”, thought to be an Aboriginal word meaning place of water, was one of four wineries in the region in the 1890's along with Quelltaler, Sevenhill, and the Stanley Wine company.

Many of the vines are now well over 100 years old, and winemaking practices date back as far. Grapes are hand-harvested, basket pressed and fermented and hand-plunged in open-top fermenters.

Shiraz, Cabernet Sauvignon, Malbec, and Mataro are the red varieties grown. Each year single variety and blended wines are crafted to reflect the vintage.

The Watervale Hotel selects particular vintages cellared to be at their peak to feature on our list.
