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| <b>Erdinger Weissbier</b><br>(500ml 5.3%) <b>Erding, Germany</b> | <b>16</b> |
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Brewed and bottled in Germany since 1886. This is a hazy pale-yellow brew, rich with yeasty, spiced bright citrus with a long mellow finish. An undisputed classic of the white beers.

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| <b>De Glazen Toren 'Jan De Lichte'</b><br>(750ml 7.0%) <b>Aalst, Belgium</b> | <b>42</b> |
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Atop-fermented Belgian Imperial Witbier using barley and wheat as well as oats and buckwheat. Early malt sweetness that is somewhat smooth at first, giving way to a citrus flavour and hop bitterness that lightens the body. As it dries out it creates a pleasantly prickly finish.

## Blonde Beer

- Ename Pater** 15  
(330ml 6.0%) **Oudenaarde, Belgium**  
Unfiltered abbey beer that sits somewhere between a witbier & a saison. Notes of citrus, fresh herbs and bright hops. medium bodied with a little malt sweetness that combines with the earthy and floral hops mixed with the Belgian yeasty esters. light on the palate with citrus and coriander.
- Paljas Saison** 17  
(330ml 6.0%) **Oostkamp, Belgium**  
Brewed with wheat and pils malt, Magnum hops for bittering and then a little dry-hopping with a mix of Amarillo, Cascade, Citra and Saaz. It makes for a light and zesty saison, with hints of citrus mixing with the light farmhouse character. It finishes dry with a little prickly hop bitterness.
- Brugse Zot** 17  
(330ml 5.0%) **Bruges, Belgium**  
A golden blond beer with a rich foam collar and a fruity yet spicy bouquet. Brewed with four different kinds of malt and two aromatic varieties of hop giving the beer its inimitable taste. The palate is complex with a certain bitterness and hints of citrus.
- La Chouffe Blonde** 17  
(330ml 8.0%) **Achouffe, Belgium**  
Starts off with some citrus notes, followed by a refreshing touch, pleasantly spiced to give it great brightness. A golden beer with a light taste of hops, that for 40 years has conquered the hearts of beer lovers the world over.
- Duvel** 18  
(330ml 8.5%) **Breendonk, Belgium**  
Four generations of the Moortgat family have been brewing this iconic Belgian beer with its Pilsner malts, Bohemian hops and novel yeast strain. It is one of the country's favourite strong blonde ales with its lively aroma and palate of fresh hops and hints of spice. Rounded mouthfeel with a lingering and refreshing dry finish.
- Delirium Tremens** 18  
(330ml 8.5%) **Huyge, Belgium**  
A rounded slightly malty pale blond with a long-lasting and dry bitter pleasant aftertaste. Unique taste resulting from the use of 3 different kinds of yeast. Consistently one of the world's most awarded beers.

## IPA

- Uiltje Dr Raptor DIPA** 19  
(330ml 8.2%) **Haarlem, Netherlands**  
The good doctor is an imperial IPA that contains most of the hop varieties you've ever heard of: Cascade, Simcoe, Mosaic, Nelson-Sauvin, Chinook, Amarillo, Centennial and Citra. No wonder then that it has an inviting tropical fruit aroma full of pineapple, grapefruit, mango and pine. A solid caramel malt base provides the backbone for all those hops. There is a sweetness to the malt, such that all those hops – as well as the considerable ABV – are covered off really well.
- Duvel Tripel Hop Cashmere** 22  
(330ml 9.5%) **Breendonk, Belgium**  
This highly sought-after newcomer to the hop world enriches the typical Duvel flavour palette with hints of citrus, peach, melon, and tropical coconut.
- De Molen Water & Vuur NEIPA** 20  
(330ml 6.0%) **Bodegraven, Netherlands**  
A cloudy NEIPA with a really inviting tropical fruit nose, the name translates as Water & Fire. Cryo Citra, Lemondrop, Simcoe and Mosaic hops are used, which offer lots of citrus flavour as well as peach and a touch of mango. The malt body is full and smooth, and there is a nice bitter hoppy finish to the beer that leaves a spicy prickle on your tongue.
- De Molen Yuzu & Kuzu Tripel IPA** 25  
(330ml 12.0%) **Bodegraven, Netherlands**  
As you may have picked up from the name, this beer has yuzu as an ingredient. It also has Kuzu, which is an Asian root vegetable commonly used for its medicinal qualities. Sweetness from the big malt body and a definite citrus character to this beer, both from the yuzu and the hops. The kuzu helps to create a creamy mouthfeel. There is a warmth from the alcohol but there really isn't any burn and the beer finishes full with a very pleasant citrus bitterness.
- Poperinge's Hommelbier** 17  
(330ml 7.5%) **Watoll, Belgium**  
Belgium's original IPA Hommel is local dialect for hops. This golden ale has a dense white head that invites you to lean in and discover the fragrance of green aromatic hops, yeast and mild fruity notes. A full and refreshing palate shifts to mild citrus, orange, and grapefruit, in combination with the hops. The sweet honeyed finish combines a slightly spicy flavor of currin, ending with a nice kick of hops.

## Trappist Beer

A legally protected trademark that may only be used if the production of the beer takes place within the monastery walls under the supervision of the monks. Proceeds from sales are intended for the livelihood of the monks and for the maintenance of the monastery. The remainder is spent on development projects and works of charity. There are only 9 official label carrying Trappist beers in the world – five Belgian, two Dutch, one English and one Italian. There are a few more monasteries that do produce beers but for various reasons do not qualify for the official Trappist label.

### Westmalle, Abdij van Onze Lieve Vrouw, Belgium

**Extra** (330ml 4.8%) **15**

A lower alcohol version of their classic tripel, the beer of choice for the monks to drink for themselves as with the lower alcohol volume their minds stay clearer so they can focus on work, prayer and other duties without being too inebriated.

**Dubbel** (330ml 7.0%) **16**

Dark red-brown beer with a rich, complex taste thanks to re-fermentation in the bottle. Touches of caramel, malt and fruity esters reminiscent of ripe banana. Dense, cream-coloured froth. The long, dry finish of this balanced, mild Trappist beer will stay with you.

**Tripel** (330ml 9.5%) **19**

In 1936 the Trappist monks of Westmalle created the world's first Tripel. Strong, blond, fruity, and malty with rich foam and a long aftertaste. This is the mother of all tripels!

### Orval, Notre Dame d'Orval, Belgium

**Trappist Ale** (330ml 6.2%) **25**

Highly sought after trappist ale favoured by connoisseurs. Dry hopping with a touch of Brett.

### Zundert De Kievit / Maria Toevlucht Abbey, Netherlands

**Tripel** (330ml 8.0%) **21**

The monks that brew this describe it as 'slightly unruly'. It is a beer you must take time to savour and understand. Chestnut-colored and bottle-conditioned, aromas of caramel, herbs and spices; initially floral and slightly sweet; character develops from light caramel to a lovely, dry, mellow hoppy bitterness as the flavour opens.

**Quadrupel** (330ml 10.0%) **22**

The scent has dried fruits, sultry herbs, liquorice and some chocolate. The taste is full and soft, balanced by a nice hop bitterness. The characteristic spiciness subtly returns in the aftertaste.

## Trappist Beer – continued

### La Trappe Koningshoeven Abbey, Netherlands

**Isid'or** (330ml 7.5%) **16**

Brewed to mark the occasion of the Trappist brewery's 125th anniversary in 2009 and named after its first brewer. Isid'or was so well received that it earned itself a permanent place in La Trappe's line-up. Unfiltered, slightly sweet amber ale with a hint of caramel, which continues to ferment after bottling and has a rich, slightly bitter flavour, and a fruity aftertaste.

**Dubbel** (330ml 7.0%) **15**

Deep brown colour and beige froth. Gentle caramel aromas and a rich malty flavour with a touch of sweetness. Smooth drinking yet has some real body and intense flavour.

**Tripel** (330ml 7.0%) **16**

Slightly malty and estery. Despite its full, rich flavour, this out-of-the-ordinary ale still has a light and dry aftertaste with a touch of bitter finesse.

**Quadrupel** (330ml 10.0%) **17**

Stunning amber colour. Warm and intense flavour, rich and finely balanced. Malty sweet, slightly burnt, and pleasantly bitter with a sweet aftertaste. Quadrupel continues to ferment after bottling and offers aromas of banana, almond and vanilla.

**Bockbier** (750ml 7.0%) **43**

The only Trappist bock ale in the world. Chestnut-coloured with a yellowish head. A unique seasonal ale with a dry, smoked and herbal flavour and a vigorous bitterness, undertones of liquorice.

**Practise what you Preach** (750ml 10.0%) **58**

Brewed in collaboration with **Brewdog** of Scotland.

This beer represents a collaboration between tradition and innovation. A place where Monks meet Punks. Brewed at La Trappe's monastery in January 2021, our Belgian Quadruple with Scottish Heather Honey and American hops. This 10% exploration of past and present was developed over an early morning tasting at BrewDog's HQ in Elton. The result is a ruby-hued liquid that boasts aromas of rich dried fruits and sweet honey. Hints of citrus fruits run subtly throughout, cutting through the sticky mouthfeel to balance out the sweetness.

## (not quite) Trappist Beer (but almost)

### **Achel, Achelse Kluis, Belgium**

The monastery where this is made (De Achelse Kluis) is technically in Belgium, however if you visit by car, the car park is just on the other side of the border in The Netherlands

In 2019 Brother Gaby & Brother Andre moved to nearby Westmalle Abbey meaning that for the first time since 1846 there were no monks left in the abbey, due to this technicality, they lost their official Trappist label. The beers are still being produced to the same recipe and under the weekly supervision of Westmalle's monks but is no longer officially trappist.

### **Blond (330ml 8.0%) 19**

Apale, strong, fruity, hoppy Tripel. Flavourful and surprisingly refreshing at 8% alcohol by volume. It is lightly filtered, but still wholesomely hazy with yeast remaining and refermenting in the bottle.

### **Bruin (330ml 8.0%) 19**

This Strong Dark Ale sits somewhere between a balanced fruity dubbel style, and the classic big dark Trappist ale. A warm caramel brown colour, aroma is a mix of rich dark stone fruits, strong Belgian yeast phenolics and earthy hops. It is in the flavour that this beer really excels, a complex mix of attributes perfectly balanced against each other to form a combination. Sweet, rich bready malts with a hint of chocolate, dark stone fruits like raisins and figs, and a slight roastiness.

### **Mont des Cats Amber Ale 49**

(750ml 7.6%) **Berthen, France**

Mont des Cats is the only French trappist monastery, they do carry the trappist label too however, this is for their production of cheese – not beer. They do not have a brewery on site but cross the border into Belgium to make this beer at Scourmont Abbey (Chimay). It still follows all the rules required to be considered a trappist beer and is made by monks within monastery walls, just not their own walls. Due to this technicality, it is not an official Trappist beer.

This beer has a caramel malt sweetness and hints of dried fruits, gentle spices and an earthy, herbal hop character. As the beer progresses, the bitterness builds toward a nice lingering finish.

### **Val Dieu Tripel 48**

(750ml 9.0%) **Aubel, Belgium**

Val-Dieu Abbey provides a tangible link to the monastic past: even now, their beers are brewed within the abbey walls using the traditional infusion method. All the main duties are performed by laymen, not monks – therefore it is not called a trappist beer but an abbey beer.

This tripel pale ale is hazy golden yellow with a scent of sweet grains, apple and honey. Hints of pepper brighten the earthy flavours of yeast and pale malt. Continues to ferment in the bottle.

## Lambic Beer

Type of beer brewed in the Pajottenland region of Belgium southwest of Brussels and in Brussels itself since the 13th century. Differing from most other beers in that it is fermented through exposure to wild yeasts and bacteria native to the Zenne valley, as opposed to exposure to carefully cultivated strains of brewer's yeast. This process gives the beer its distinctive flavour: dry, vinous, and cidery, often with a tart aftertaste.

### **Hanssens Oude Geuze 27**

(375ml 6.0%) **Beersel, Belgium**

Blend of fine Lambics, matured in oak barrels, spontaneously fermented in the bottle.

### **Boon, Lambeek, Belgium**

### **Oude Geuze (375ml 7.0%) 27**

100% spontaneous fermentation Lambic Ale. Brewed in the cold months between October & April, then aged in oak casks for 1, 2 or 3 years and then blended. It is unfiltered, unpasteurised and unsweetened, it will continue to referment in the bottle and will age well for upto 20 years.

### **Kriek (375ml 4.0%) 23**

Traditional Lambic Ale with 25% fresh cherries

### **Framboise (375ml 5.0%) 28**

Traditional Lambic Ale with 30% fresh raspberries & 5% wild fresh cherries

### **Oud Beersel, Beersel, Belgium**

### **Oude Kriek (375ml 6.0%) 29**

Traditional Lambic Ale with 400g sour cherries per litre giving it a pleasant sourness.

Gold medal winner at AIBA – best Kriek.

### **Oude Framboise (375ml 6.0%) 29**

Traditional Lambic Ale made with whole raspberries.

### **Horal's Oude Geuze Megablend 2019 88**

(750ml 7.0%) **Lambeek, Belgium**

A collaboration of 8 different breweries blended this especially for the 12<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Tour de Geuze. A blend of 1, 2, and 3 year old Lambic beers that are continuing to develop in the bottle since early 2019.

- Jacobins Kriek Max** 16  
(250ml 3.5%) **Bellegem, Belgium**  
Fruity, yummy, bright red and fairly sweet. Made with 25% cherry juice.
- Vichtenaar Flemish Red Ale** 16  
(250ml 5.1%) **Vichte, Belgium**  
Mild sour reddish-brown ale. Wild fermented and aged 8 months in large oak foeders. Refreshing and lively with notes of Madeira, vanilla and fresh apple.
- VanderGhinste Flanders Sour Ale** 15  
(250ml 5.5%) **Bellegem, Belgium**  
Mild sour red-brown ale
- Maltgarden Trunk Full of Fruits** 16  
(500ml 3.5%) **Kolobrzeg, Poland**  
Passionfruit, Calamansi & Lime on a Berliner Weisse base.
- Duchess de Bourgogne** 20  
(330ml 6.2%) **Vichte, Belgium**  
Traditional top fermented reddish-brown ale from Flanders. This refined ale is a blend of 8 and 18 month old ales following maturation in oak casks. 100% natural and unpasteurised. Fresh acidity.
- Duchess Chocolate Cherry** 21  
(330ml 6.8%) **Vichte, Belgium**  
Fruity sour cherry with a touch of Belgian chocolate.
- Alvinne Phi** 16  
(330ml 8.0%) **Zwevegem, Belgium**  
Blond sour beer. A solid malt backbone gives an early sweetness and heavier mouthfeel. Acidity quickly comes to the front and Morpheus yeast gives off a little funkiness as well as the sour notes.
- Alvinne Farmhouse Sour #3 Brett Kweeper/Quince** 23  
(330ml 8.0%) **Zwevegem, Belgium**  
Blond sour tripel fermented with a wild *Brettanomyces* yeast as well as Morpheus yeast, with macerated quince from the 2020 harvest

## Tripel Beer non-Trappist

- De Glazen Toren Odineke Tripel** 19  
(330ml 8.5%) **Aalst, Belgium**  
Traditional Belgian Tripel. Soft, fruity, slightly spicy and with a lingering bitterness in the finish.
- Adriaen Brouwer Tripel** 20  
(330ml 9.0%) **Oudenaarde, Belgium**  
100% Organic Tripel, with ingredients such as coriander, Curacao and organic Belgian hops, resulting in a spicy premium organic tripel with 9 percent alcohol by volume.
- Bosteels Tripel Karmeliet** 18  
(330ml 8.4%) **Buggenhout, Belgium**  
The famous 3 grain tripel. Refined and complex golden-to-bronze brew with a creamy head. These characteristics derive not only from the grains used but also from restrained hopping with Styrians and the fruity nature of the house yeast. Aroma has hints of vanilla mixed with citrus and banana.
- Troubadour Magma Vina 2023** 21  
(330ml 8.5%) **Sint Gillis-Waas, Belgium**  
Variant of Troubadour's Magma Tripel IPA fermented with a wine yeast that converts the sugars in 'wort' (the base of beer) and produces wonderfully intensely fruity aromas (apricot, apple, grape, banana, mango, starfruit) in the process. Also a malty character with a touch of caramel biscuit.
- Straffe Hendrik Tripel** 23  
(330ml 9.0%) **Bruges, Belgium**  
Multi award winning strong Belgian triple, aromatic & rich. Brewed with a selection of Saaz and Styrian hops and a blend of six varieties of malt giving the beer a balanced and powerful taste. Golden in colour, the aroma is spicy with hints of black pepper, coriander, and ginger.
- Lefort Tripel** 22  
(330ml 8.8%) **Bellegem, Belgium**  
The nose is filled with red apple, banana, vanilla and clove. Biscuit malt body. A solid hop bitterness.
- Delirium Nocturnum** 20  
(330ml 8.5%) **Huyghe, Belgium**  
The darker side of Delirium! A strong dark beer with beautiful caramel, chocolate and spice aromas leading in to a bitter flavour profile delivered from the malt and hops.

## Quadrupel Beer non-Trappist

### **De Molen Zoet & Zalig Apfelstrudel Quadrupel** 24

(330ml 9.3%) **Bodegraven, Netherlands**

Apples, raisins and cinnamon are the main ingredients for an apple pie. Combine these ingredients with a quadrupel and you get a beautiful dessert beer. Full, sweet, and heartwarming.

### **Atrium Train de Ridera** 22

(330ml 9.8%) **Marche-en-Famenne, Belgium**

Rum & Raisin quadruple Collaboration with DOK Brewing with a rich malt complexity, which leaves it thicker than the Trappist versions. A dark brown colour with dark red reflexes and a clear brown foam. Delicious dark fruity esters and smooth balance between alcohol and malts.

### **Lefort 10** 23

(330ml 10.0%) **Bellegem, Belgium**

Quadrupel - roasted barley malts, flavoured with chocolate and caramel. Voted best dark in the world at VBA17. Top fermented Belgian Beer with refermentation in the bottle. LeFort is a complex dark beer, with sweet, fruity and soft notes. The pale and roasted dark barley malts provide a smooth balanced taste, with flavours of caramel and chocolate. The beer is an ode to Brasserie LeFort: a beautiful, old brewery in Kortrijk, that was well known in the 20th Century for its strong top fermented beers.

### **Gouden Carolus Whisky Infused** 24

(330ml 11.7%) **Mechelen, Belgium**

Brewed by Het Anker, this special edition sees Cuvee van de Keizer Imperial Dark infused with Gouden Carolus single malt whisky distilled from batches of Gouden Carolus Tripel. The result is a unique beer: powerful and full-bodied, with subtle touches of vanilla, oak and chocolate. An imperial brew to cherish and enjoy in moderation.

An incredibly classic example of a Russian Imperial, expect plenty of robust chocolate & coffee on the palate with lots of staying power!

### **Kees Orange Trempee** 23

(440ml 7.6%) **Middelburg, Netherlands**

Stout with oranges from Holland and pure Belgian chocolate.

A collaboration of Kees & De Dochter van de Korenaar, both very creative brewers who like to push boundaries and explore what they can do with beer. The result is a very tasty, slightly sweet but not in dessert stout territory beer with vibes of jaffa. Aroma is full of chocolate, caramel, dark fruits and some roasty malt. Those aromas do come through in the flavour with a balance of bitterness, roasted malt astringency and an uplifting orange citrus. Smooth mouthfeel and wonderful balance that leaves a bitter zing in the aftertaste.

### **Kees Purple is the new Black** 23

(330ml 10.5%) **Middelburg, Netherlands**

Imperial pastry stout that uses Ube (a purple yam from The Philippines), delivering notes of sweet potato, coconut and vanilla. And it's purple!

### **De Struise Black Albert** 29

(330ml 13.0%) **Oostvleteren, Belgium**

Struise's famous Russian Imperial Stout. Not as much a beer as it is an experience. Despite the 13% ABV, it is dangerously drinkable. With its thick, tar-like body, it's definitely a sipper, but the alcohol is very well-hidden. Every sip bombards you with roasty bitterness and the unique sweetness of real Belgian candy sugar.
